Share how you can help refugees and people seeking asylum feel welcome in your community.






The activities you are about to do were created by six people who have **experience** of migration.







Think about the last choice you made today...


Did you know...

If you had to leave home quickly, which items would you take with you?








Did you know...

Since then, he has played for some of the top clubs in the world, such as Real Madrid, and won the Ballon d'Or.










